According to the National Association for Gifted Children, “Gifted individuals are those who demonstrate outstanding levels of aptitude (defined as an exceptional ability to reason and learn) or competence (documented performance or achievement in top 10% or rarer) in one or more domains. Domains include any structured area of activity with its own symbol system (e.g., mathematics, music, language) and/or set of sensorimotor skills (e.g., painting, dance, sports).” There are families across the nation who have children who fall into this category, and summer can be a challenging time – there are, however, colleges who make summer a time for these gifted individuals to grow, learn and be challenged in unique ways.
