

# **Transfer School Application Rubric**

The evaluation criteria below provides a framework for the approval of transfer applications for sponsorship. In addition to evaluating the written application provided, the review team will conduct research into the proposed school founders and their history with community schools. The team will also interview the school founders, the board, and any management company. Each reviewer is required to individually score each application and document his/her rating in accordance with the rubric to specify evidence of his/her decision. Each reviewer is trained on reviewer protocols and completion of this rubric when accepting transfer applications.

Each question will be worth between 1 and 4 points. A proposed transfer school must earn at least 75% of the possible points to be considered for sponsorship.

#### Exceeds Standards – 4 Points

The proposed school exceeds expectations and has clearly demonstrated the capacity of operating a successful community school. The school has clearly outlined expectations of the components and has exceeded review criteria established for this standard.

### **Meets Standards – 3 Points**

The proposed school meets the minimum expectation for an effective and successful community school. The school has outlined expectations of the component and has met review criteria established for the standard.

## **Approaching Standards – 2 Points**

The proposed school does not adequately address the component question or meet the established criteria. It is unclear whether the school is likely to be successful without additional work or development.

#### Falls Far Below Standards – 1 Point

The proposed school does not address the component questions and fails to meet the minimum expectations set by the review criteria. The application is poorly researched, and the school, as presented, would be unlikely to succeed.

The final evaluation point total is only a component of Mid-Ohio ESC's consideration for sponsorship. The point total of this evaluation does not guarantee that a school will be recommended for an interview or for sponsorship.

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
